

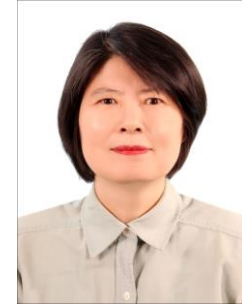

Huree University Faculty Members Have Two Papers Accepted for Publication at MMT2026

Two research papers by faculty members of the Department of Computer Science at Huree University have been accepted for publication at MMT2026, one of Mongolia's leading international academic conferences in the fields of science and technology.



The accepted papers are "The Technical Debt of Rapid Digitalization: A Quantitative Analysis of Software Maturity in Mongolia" by Professor **Kim Young-mi** of the Department of Computer Science, and "Modeling Ecological Stability via Combined Phenotypic Plasticity and Genetic Evolution: A Unity-based Agent Simulation" by Professor Bilguun of the same department.

Professor Kim Young-mi's paper quantitatively analyzes software maturity and the technical debt that can arise during Mongolia's rapid digital transformation. The study is meaningful in that it academically examines issues related to the sustainability and quality management of information systems at a time when digital transformation is accelerating across Mongolian society.

Professor **Bilguun**'s paper models the effects of phenotypic plasticity and genetic evolution on ecological stability through a Unity-based agent simulation. This research has value as an interdisciplinary study that uses computer simulation to analyze the stability and adaptation processes of complex ecological systems.

MMT, which stands for **Монголын Мэдээллийн Технологи**, is a continuing academic conference in the field of information technology, initiated by the Mongolian Information Technology Consortium. Since its launch in 2013, MMT has been held annually and has established itself as one of Mongolia's prominent academic forums based on IT research, technological innovation, industry-academia cooperation, and international exchange.

This achievement is especially meaningful because it marks the first time Huree University has submitted papers to the MMT conference. The university submitted a total of three papers to MMT2026, of which two were accepted for publication.

The acceptance of these papers is expected to serve as an important starting point for Huree University's active participation in Mongolia's science, technology, and information technology research networks. It is also anticipated to provide a positive opportunity to promote the research capabilities of the Department of Computer Science and to expand future academic exchange and joint research with Mongolian and international scholars.

Huree University Actively Promotes the School to Prospective Students

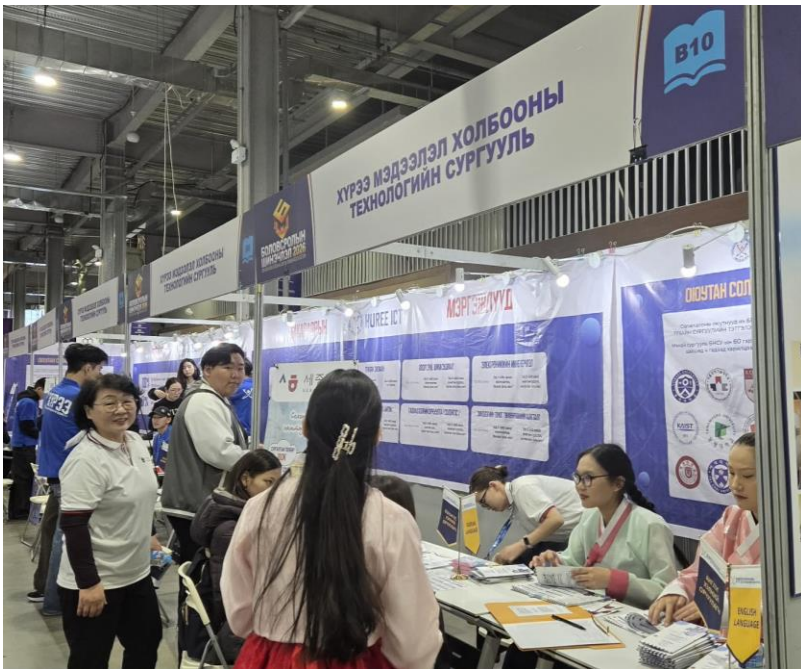

Huree University Cafeteria Reopens in April After Renovation
