Oh Seung-hoon Donates Laboratory Equipment to the Department of Food and Nutrition

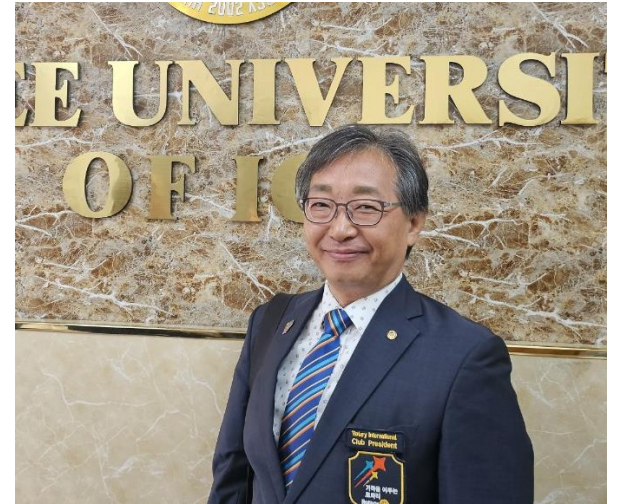

Mongolian Ministry of Education Conducts Inspection

Evaluation for University Status Upgrade Underway

On February 13, the Mongolian Ministry of Education conducted an official inspection at Huree University to assess its eligibility for an upgrade to 'Ikh' status. This evaluation is part of the ministry's policy to restructure Mongolia's higher education system, consolidating the current three-tier classification of 'Ikh,' 'Ded,' and 'College' into two categories: 'Ikh' and 'College.' The restructuring process is set to be completed by June this year.

During the inspection, a panel of 14 evaluators thoroughly examined various aspects of the university, including administrative operations, educational quality, facilities, and research activities. In preparation for this assessment, faculty and staff worked tirelessly for over a week to ensure all necessary documents were meticulously prepared.

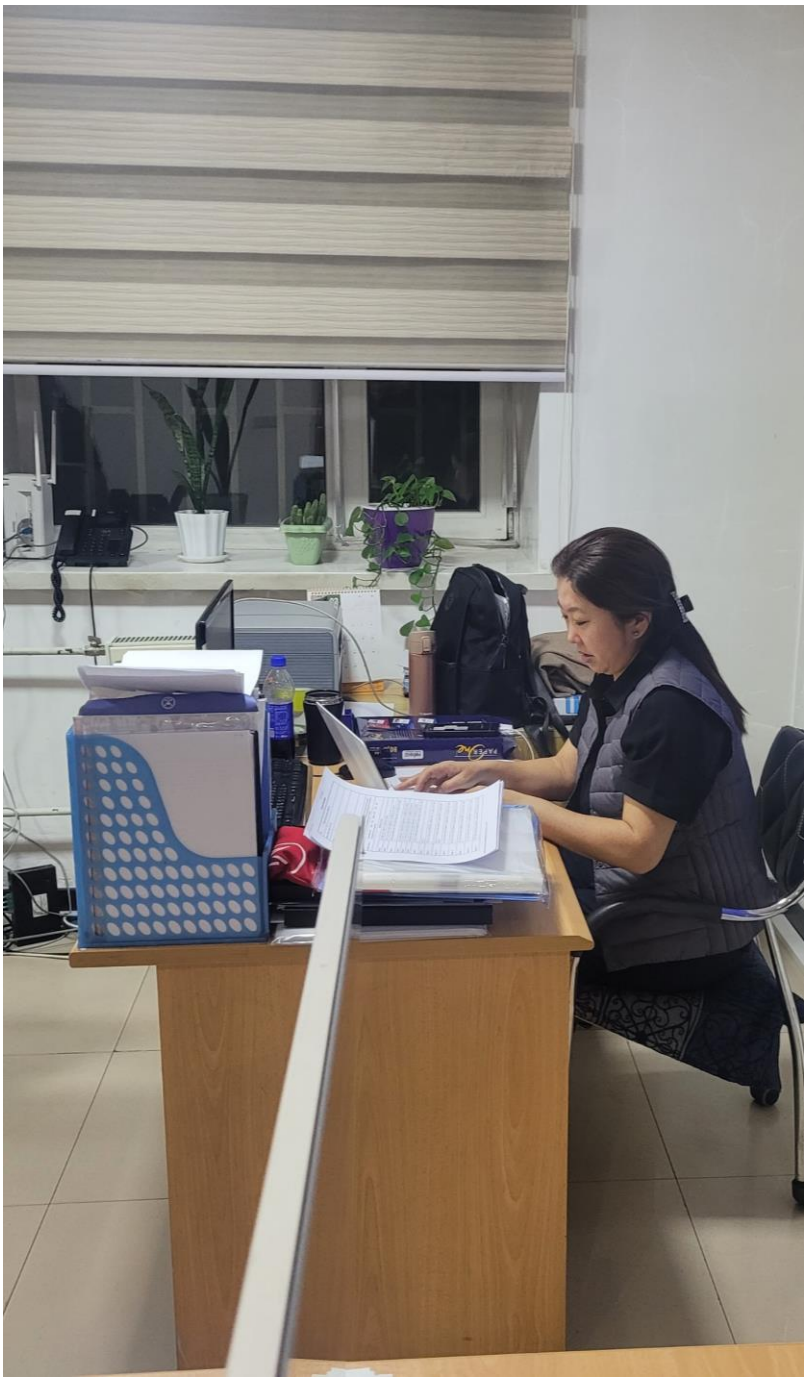
Meanwhile, the Mongolian Ministry of Education has announced that similar inspections will be conducted at all universities across the country by the end of March, with the final results expected to be released in April.

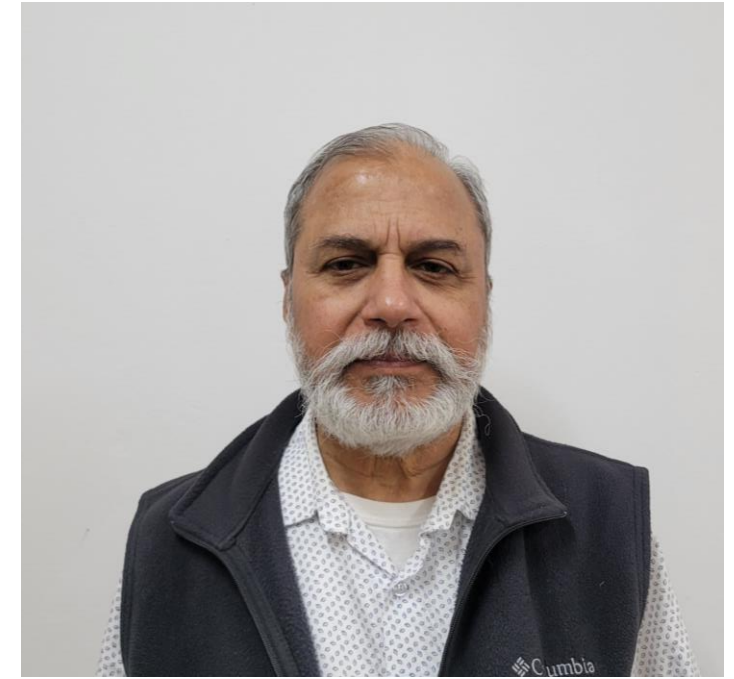
All three professors are highly dedicated educators with deep expertise in their respective fields. Their leadership is expected to bring positive changes to both their departments and the university as a whole.

NIPA Representatives Visit Huree University for K-LAB Installation

On February 25, two representatives from the National IT Industry Promotion Agency (NIPA) visited Huree University regarding the establishment of a K-LAB.

K-LAB is a Korean Official Development Assistance (ODA) project that supports developing countries by providing smart factory equipment and educational programs. It offers advanced machinery such as CNC and laser cutters, along with training on their utilization.

Huree University, in collaboration with the Mongolian University of Science and Technology, applied for this program. NIPA selected Mongolia as a candidate country for support, leading to this on-site visit.

The university expects positive outcomes from this visit, anticipating that the installation of K-LAB will significantly contribute to technological advancement and educational development in Mongolia.
