Huree University Faculty Publish Papers in International Journals

Huree University continues to strengthen its academic research profile, as faculty members from the School of Information Technology and the Department of Information and Communication Engineering have recently published multiple papers in internationally recognized journals.

Professor **Kang-gyu Jin** from the School of Information Technology has successfully published two research papers following rigorous peer review processes.

His publications include:

“Design of Novel TDOF Nonlinear PID Controllers for Linear and Nonlinear Systems”,
published in *Studies in Informatics and Control* (SCIE-indexed journal)

“MPPT and Output Voltage Regulation of a Photovoltaic System Based on Dual-stage Conversion and Nonlinear PI Control”, published in the *Journal of Institute of Control, Robotics and Systems* (Scopus-indexed journal)

These works contribute to advancing control systems engineering, particularly in nonlinear control and renewable energy applications.

Further Contributions from Information Technology Department

In addition, Professor **Otgonbaatar Yura** from the Department of Information Technology published two papers in international journals in March.

His research includes:

“Evaluation of Rain Attenuation Prediction for C, Ku and Ka Frequency Satellite Links in Mongolia by Using ITU-R Propagation Model”, published in IOSR Journals

“Cloud Attenuation Prediction at High Frequency by Using ITU-R Model for Satellite Links in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia”, published in the International Journal of Innovative Science and Research Technology (SJIF Impact Factor: 8.716)

These studies focus on satellite communication performance and atmospheric attenuation modeling, providing valuable insights for improving communication reliability in Mongolia’s unique climatic conditions.
